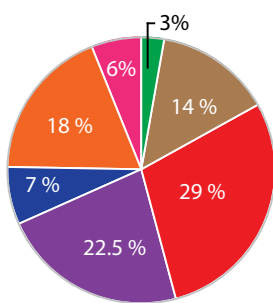

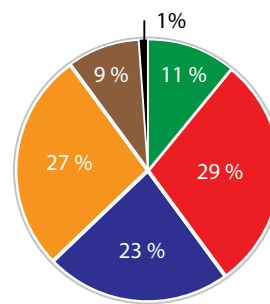

Site Demographics

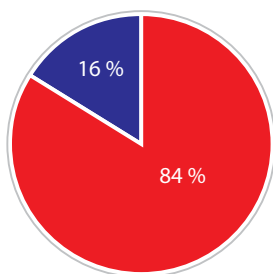

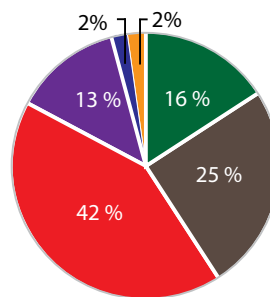
